The growth of human civilization also added to their suffering. Today only two species are alive -

the African elephant and the Asian elephant. They not only inhabit different geographical regions, but also have distinct physical characteristics. Asian elephants are smaller in size than the African elephants. They are more easily tamed than their larger and wilder African counterparts. In fact humans have used the docile Asian elephants for over 5000 years as beasts of burden, in warfare, and in ceremonial activities.
