It is shocking to observe many car, bus and truck drivers stopping in the middle of a road to exchange pleasantries with friends.

Blowing horn unnecessarily is considered not only uncivil, it is even illegal in several countries. However, if you are late even by a second in giving way to the driver behind you in India, deafening horns, followed by headlights and a couple of abuses follow in quick succession.

Driving with a high beam on is another nuisance nearly blinding the person on the opposite side. Many have additional extra bright lights fitted to complete the blinding effect and make sure of an accident.

The world is fast becoming a global village. Nevertheless, to many minds culture suggests a kind of polish, a superficial refinement; it is thought of as a privilege of the favoured few
